## Cottages...

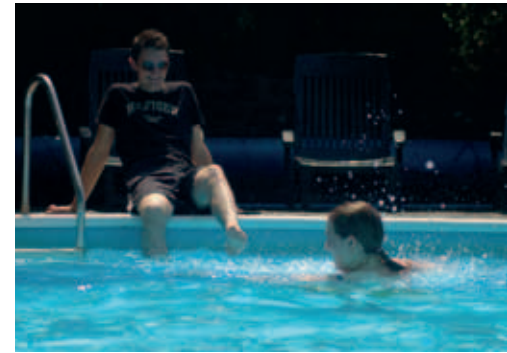

# Weddings...

As a licensed venue for civil wedding ceremonies we specialise in small, intimate weddings at Barclay House.

In collaboration with Cornwall Wildlife Trust we also offer an exclusive once in a lifetime opportunity to marry on legendary St. George's Island. The island is known to date back to 1139 and includes the ruins of a Benedictine chapel, the 22 acre island is now managed by the Trust as a marine nature reserve with weddings limited strictly to 12 per year, making it one of the most coveted venues in Cornwall.

This unique package means that guests and the bride and groom arrive by boat from the mainland with numbers strictly limited to no more than 32 guests. After the ceremony, guests are escorted from the island to the reception and wedding breakfast at Barclay House.



# Events...

The 6 acres of ever-changing scenery at Barclay House present a stimulating setting for a small team gathering or event, small private event spaces can also be hired for informal meetings during the stay.

We also cater for private dinners and events as the 2 AA rosette awarded restaurant can be exclusively hired for functions such as a Christmas party, charity dinner or birthday celebration.



# How to find us...

## By Road

From London take the M3 then the A303 to Exeter via Stonehenge; alternatively from London, take the M4 to Bristol, then M5 to Exeter. From Exeter take the A38 to Plymouth. Cross the Tamar Bridge and you are in Cornwall. Stay on this road for approximately 10 miles from the Tamar Bridge. Then turn left onto the A387 signposted to Looe. After approximately 1 mile, turn right, signposted to Looe, then follow this road for 7 miles. As you wind down into Looe we are the first hotel on the left. From London, approximately 4.5 hours drive.

## By Rail

InterCity Service from London Paddington to Plymouth or Liskeard, approx. 3.5 hours. Taxi service is available from the railway station. There is also a branch line from Liskeard to Looe, stopping 2 minutes from the hotel. Arrangements can happily be made to meet international visitors from the station. Turn left out of the station, we are 2 minutes up the hill.

## By Air

Ryanair operate daily flights from Stanstead to Newquay (we are 1 hours drive from Newquay). Air South West operate daily flights from London Gatwick to Plymouth. Approx flying time 50 minutes. We are only 18 miles from Plymouth. Car hire and taxi services are available from the airport. Arrangements can happily be made to meet international visitors from the station. There is also an airport at Exeter, should you be arriving from other parts of the UK or abroad.
